Judge Cohill and Jim Leckie began working together to mentor children sent to the courts. Youth Guidance is born with Jim Leckie as first president.

1980

40 acres in Beaver County, the "Lord's Acres Camp" was donated to YGI. This later grew to 112 acres becoming today's Promise Camp.

1988

Bob Jamison became President and served for the next 24 years.

2000

Youth Guidance merged with Family Ministries to become Family Guidance, Inc. Later that year the Manhood Mentoring program was launched to reach high-risk fatherless teenage boys.

2004

The Promise Camp Capital Campaign begins...raising enough money to build a new activities center, pool and gym which have provided a great camping experience for countless at-risk children.

2013

Brian Johansson becomes President and CEO. Brian and Peggy moved from New York City where Brian served as the Vice President of the Bowery Mission for 20 years.

1969

Youth Guidance formed its trademark One-to-One mentoring program and added a summer camping ministry at a rented space.

1982

YGI moved to new headquarters in Sewickley, PA built on land donated by Helen Grove.

The Club program was born offering specialized support to youth and families in Aliquippa public housing.

1995

Youth Guidance launched the Y.E.S. Program to develop urban after-school programs.

2001

DADDs (Dedicated and Devoted Dads), was born in 2001. Jim Leckie retired and became Founder and Retired Chairman.

2005

The LAMP new mentoring program begins in Homewood.. In 2006 TTwogether Pittsburgh was formed - Pennsylvania's largest relationship and marriage education program.

2014

Family Guidance celebrates its 50th Anniversary with its first Gala. New Branding is rolled out and ground is broken for the new Promise Camp Dining Hall.
